1. Organisational Structure of Camillian Social Center Rayong

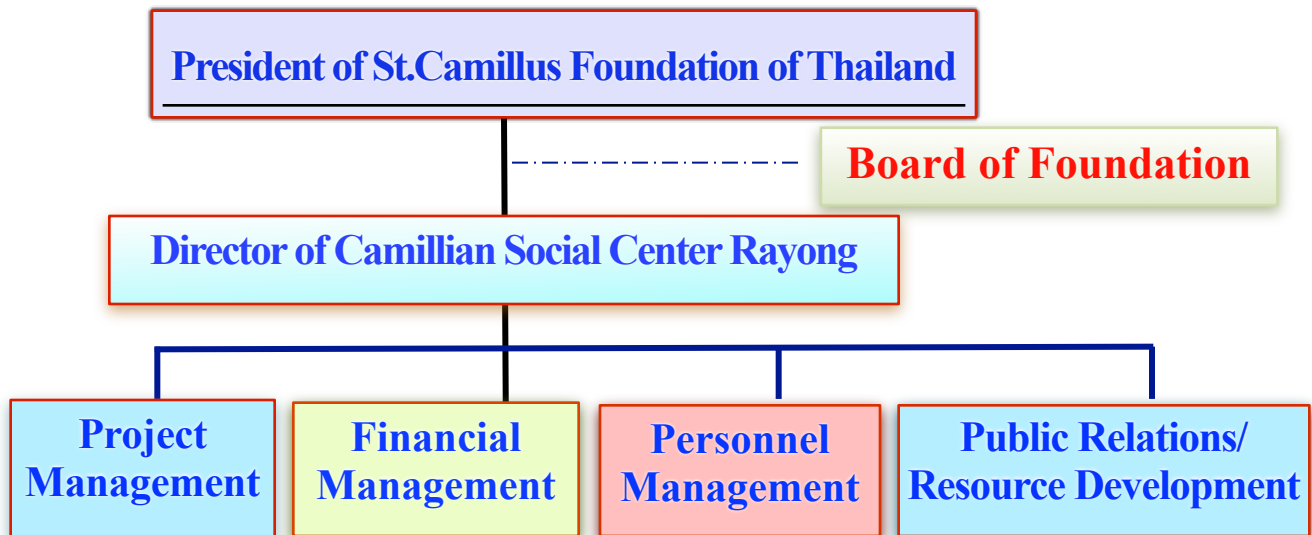


Chart 1 Organisational Structure

2. Vision, Goal, Objectives and Identity of Camillian Social Center Rayong

2.1 Vision

Trained people, people living with HIV and people affected by AIDS under the care of Camillian Social Center Rayong are enabled to live with dignity as a human person based on their faiths, cultures and traditions.

2.2 Goal

Quality of life of the trained people, people living with HIV and people affected by AIDS improved.

2.3 Objectives

- 1) Give training to the public on HIV and AIDS, and develop communication skill on care and support to AIDS patients.
- 2) Give pastoral care, support and assistance to the poor, especially those living with HIV and AIDS patients.
- 3) Give assistance to orphans living with HIV to have access to antiretroviral therapy and education, and take care of children affected by AIDS.

- 4) Give direct counseling to people and through media and eastern network of people living with HIV/AIDS, and collaborate with concerned state agencies and private sector to manage situation on HIV and AIDS at all levels all across the country.

2.4 Identify of Camillian Social Center Rayong

Apply religious teachings, good cultures and traditions; promote the value of human dignity as direction for a living towards improved quality of life.

2.5 Identify of Camillian Social Center Rayong

Adopt holistic approach to the work on HIV and AIDS. As a faith-based organization, its work adopts the holistic approach by dealing with all the health, economic, social, cultural, spiritual dimension and public policies related to individuals and society as a whole in a linking inseparable manner.

3. Projects and activities implemented to achieve the set objectives in 2012

In 2012, vaccination was given for prevention against flu to all children and caregivers</p> <p>3. Sent sick children with HIV and other illnesses to hospital for medical care.</p> <p>4. Gave training to the children to prepare them for antiretroviral therapy and other healthcare.</p> <p>5. Sent the children to get skill building on soccer sports with PTT Group, and organised soccer against the executives and caregivers twice a month.</p> <p>6. Organised catechetical and spiritual renewal camp.</p> <p>7. Organised social activities, such as garbage collecting along Namrin Beach in Ban Chang District, and shared toys and personal stuff to children in the neighbourhood.</p> <p>8. To develop youth in their physical, emotional, social and spiritual dimensions to prepare them for reintegration with society and be able to live their own life well in the future by themselves 2. To provide and promote opportunity for participation in their society, such as school and community. 3. To raise good awareness in young people on social responsibility with empathy towards other people that they live together. 	<p>16 Youth living with HIV and affected by AIDS at the ages of 13-22 classified as follows.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. youth living with HIV (9 young women and 6 young men) 2. A young girl affected by AIDS. <p><u>Activities</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Admitted youth from the children center program, provided them with care and preparation for self-caring. 2. Gave regular training on adherence, healthcare, prevention, and follow-up of medical care at hospital by themselves. 3. Gave training to youth on health, HIV/AIDS, opportunistic infections and antiretroviral medicines. 4. Promoted spiritual development and Catholic catechetical lessons with priests. Organised spiritual renewal and retreat camp. 5. Supported education by caring and monitoring their study and providing counselling to youth. 6. Sent the youth for soccer training with PTT Football Club and school football teams. 7. Organised community activities, such as activity on Children’s Day in Nong Grub Community, Ban Khai District, cleaning compound in Soi Prapa and Kiri Streets, built a pig pen and charcoal kiln at Lorenzo Home in Panasnikom District, Chonburi Province, and volunteered to take care of patients at PCU program of CSC Rayong.

<p>3.Palliative Care Unit (PCU)</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To help AIDS patients to get physical, mental, social and spiritual assistance, support and care with human dignity. 2. To help AIDS patients reduce their sickness, anxieties, and rehabilitate their physical and mental conditions with improved relationship with society. 	<p>Poor and abandoned AIDS patients got support and care with human dignity.</p> <p>In 2012, PCU took care of 108 AIDS patients who were 47 women and 61 men at the ages of 18 - 60+.</p> <p><u>Activities</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Admitted patients referred from hospital or provincial office of human development and human security, performed health screening, provided primary healthcare and referred to doctors at hospitals 2. Gave training to healthy patients on HIV, opportunistic infections, antiretroviral medicines and prevention. 3. Organised religious/spirituality activities through religious rituals on different occasions. 4. Organised activities for preparation of peaceful departure and will. 5. Provided aroma therapy. 6. Provided musical therapy on birthdays and other special days. 7. Organised physical exercise and rehabilitation of patient who have temporarily lost their capacities. 8. Organised handicraft training for relaxation. 9. Organised spiritual activities and provided counselling. 10. Organised community service activities to improve landscape around the center and in Soi Kiri Street.

<p>4.Garden of Eden</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To help people living with HIV to have temporary shelter and vocational skills. 2. To help people living with HIV to have access to proper and continuous healthcare. 	<p>People living with HIV who are ready to be reintegrated with society.</p> <p>In 2012, CSC Rayong provided care to 47 people who lived with HIV. They were 22 women and 25 men at the age of 16-67.</p> <p><u>Activities</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Grew hydroponic vegetables and fruit trees. Raised animals, such as cows, pigs, ducks, turkeys, chicken geese, catfish, frogs and crickets. 2. Gave vocational skills training and assistance on marketing of products, such as magnet butterfly, dragonfly and bees, bags and caps made from recycled soft-drink cans, woven baskets, key rings, beads, photo frame, heart-shape box, greetings card made from local paper, etc. 3. Wage earning outside the center, such as at organic fertilizer plant, contractors, etc. 4. Sent them to get additional training on TB at Nong Bua local administration organisation and Ban Khai Hospital. 5. Sent patients for medical treatment of opportunistic infections, and followed up of antiretroviral therapy by themselves at hospitals.

Education for HIV/AIDS prevention</p>	<p>1.The rate of new infections in girls, boys, youth, women and men was reduced.</p> <p>2.Networks and stakeholders were empowered and mobilized to address HIV and AIDS.</p> <p>3.Prevention policies were developed and materialised.</p>	<p>4,205 girls, boys, youth, women and men from 58 organisations who were affected by HIV/AIDS have capacity to manage the situation of discrimination, stigma and violation of rights. They were prevention leaders, students, community volunteers, sex workers, employees and people on exposure visits to CSC Rayong.</p> <p><u>Activities</u></p> <p>1.Provided education on HIV/AIDS prevention and various programs of CSC Rayong for exposure groups visiting CSC Rayong and volunteers, 49 times. And gave 10 training on reproductive health to sex workers in 4 entertainment establishments.</p> <p>2.Facilitated development of action plan and policies on HIV prevention with executive personnel and leader in schools, workplaces, communities, local administration organisations and entertainment establishments, total 35 times for 28 organisations.</p> <p>3.Made field monitoring and support to leaders in activities on dissemination of information and awareness raising according to their action plans, and prepared and supported campaign and training media as well as distributing condoms 98 times at 30 organisations.</p> <p>4.Organised activities to promote and empower prevention network, such as network forum 5 times a year, prevention leaders camp once a year, campaign on World AIDS Day once a year, and campaign on ‘Change’ of sexual behaviours.</p>

Empowerment of Eastern Network of people living with HIV/AIDS</p>	<p>1.The rate of new infections in girls, boys, youth, women and men was reduced.</p> <p>2.Networks and stakeholders were empowered and mobilized to address HIV and AIDS.</p> <p>3.Prevention policies were developed and materialised.</p>	<p>Girls, boys, youth, women and men affected by HIV/AIDS in eastern region have capacity to manage the situation of discrimination, stigma and violation of rights.</p> <p>The Eastern Network of people living with HIV/AIDS has a total membership of 67 local groups in 8 eastern provinces with 18,862 members.</p> <p><u>Activities</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Held meetings of regional committee every 3 months. 2. Suported to the local groups of people living with HIV/AIDS to participate on the healthcare activity with local hospitals. 3. Supported provincial networks and local groups of people living with HIV/AIDS to work with local administration organisations in disseminating knowledge on HIV/AIDS prevention, care, living together, and campaign on condom use among people living with HIV/AIDS. 4. Took part in demonstration against India-EU FTA, the policy to collect 30 Baht initiate by national office of health security, advocacy for Social Security Scheme to include coverage on Atazanavir for people living with HIV/AIDS.

Scholarship was transferred monthly by post to the children or they came to get it at CSC Rayong. 2. Monitoring was done through regular correspondence with the children.

Adoption for orphans living with or affected by HIV/AIDS</p>	<p>Orphaned children and youth got education and had good quality of life.</p>	<p>47 orphaned children and youth living with HIV and 17 children and youth affected by AIDS, total 64 children and youth in the care of CSC Rayong got proper education and were able to live their life with good quality through sponsorship of adopting parents.</p> <p><u>Activities</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Sent emails monthly to adopting parents. 2. Contacted and facilitated adopting parents to regularly visit the children at CSC Rayong. 3. Sent information and news and public relations through various media to identify more adopting parents.

The program revised and published a new brochure on introduction to Camillian Social Center Rayong (CSC Rayong) to share information and news to supporters, and build good relationship between CSC Rayong and its supporters that we keep in our database for ongoing resource development. 2. It identified sponsors in the adoption program entitled “Bridge of Hope’ from 197 in the 2011 database to 223 in 2012. 3. It initiated a project of credit card point donation with Krungsri Bank, Tesco Lotus and Standard Chartered Bank to donate points to CSC Rayong. 4. It developed lunch program for orphans living with or affected by HIV/AIDS and a project on ‘One Factory One Sponsor’. 5. It put donation boxes at 100 more enterprises in Rayon and neighboring areas. 6. It organized a charity bike rally with Association of Bicycles for Thai Health and several other bicycles clubs. 7. It co-organized charity golf game with Dive-tide Limited and Camel Pub at Ban Chang, Rayong Province.
