

Introduction

This annual report is prepared to present the operation of Camillian Social Center Rayong (CSC Rayong) on management of HIV/AIDS situation in Rayong in 2014 (January 1 - December 31, 2014). It describes performances of project activities to achieve expected results and finally to realize the set objectives. CSC Rayong has organized its operation into 7 major projects, namely 1) Home for orphans living with and affected by HIV/AIDS, 2) Independent Living Center for Youth, 3) Palliative Care Unit, 4) Garden of Eden, 5) Education for HIV/AIDS Prevention, 6) Empowerment of Eastern Network of people living with HIV/AIDS, 7) Scholarship for children affected by HIV/AIDS. CSC Rayong has also the other two minor projects, which are 1) Sponsorship for Orphans living with and affected by HIV/AIDS, 2) Public Relations and Resource Development. Moreover, this report also presents its financial report.

The above projects were implemented to improve quality of life of those who got training, people living with HIV and those affected by AIDS.

It is with high hope that this annual report would be useful for different concerned organization interested people in general.

I would like to thank all who have given hands to make this operation successful and achieve the expected results.

Children and Teenagers living with and affected by HIV/AIDS:

From illness to grew up with better quality of life and better future.

The orphaned children living with and affected by HIV/AIDS had accumulated the total of 119 children and teenagers of 48 persons at Camillian Social Center Rayong under the supervision of Camillian from 1999 to 2014. There were only 10% dead rate from all children and teenagers. Others were grown up to adults. This is due to the fact that we had provided good care and monitoring them continuing without any interruption. Therefore they could grow up as a normal person with better quality of life.

In year 2014, Camillian Social Center Rayong had accepted 3 orphaned children living with HIV/AIDS and 2 orphaned children affected by HIV/AIDS. There was only one child dead with sickness with unclassified diseases. We had transferred 5 children from Child Care Center to Independent Living Center. There were 7 children and teenagers reintegrated into normal society. At the end of 2014, there were 46 orphaned children living with and affected by HIV/AIDS and 15 teenagers under caring of Camillian Social Center Rayong.

The Orphaned children living with and affected by HIV/AIDS: Caring with Holistic Approach

There was good trend of 27 orphaned children infected from HIV mother compared between the first arrival to our Center and at present. In addition there were 19 orphaned children affected by HIV/AIDS had better quality of life as well. When Camillian Social Center Rayong had the project of Child Care Center, it gave the opportunity for children to access regular health care system including all basic needs. There were also living in a very good atmosphere with father/mother care as if they were living in their own home. When they had passed through the dead of HIV/AIDS period and to live in a better quality of life in spite of that they are living with HIV but understanding of they are living with the controllable condition.

Other than health aspect, those children living with and affected by HIV/AIDS had also other needs as normal children. Therefore, Camillian Social Center Rayong had supported them in the field of education, skills of occupation as well as the living in normal society condition in future. The Child Care Project had supported the education for those children by sending them to the normal school in the community according to their age range and their absorption capacity, which they had shown and expressed with good outcome from their activities in the school. They were happy with their friends and teachers, which showed the good sign for them to reintegrate into the normal society with happiness.

In 2014, the Child Care Project had organized the capacity building camp on life skills for the orphaned children at Lung Kom's garden (camp) at Chanthaburi province for 3 days. This was the continuing activities from their previous year. Those activities were covered with self-help activity, adaptation on their behavior to live with others, etc. From their experiences, they had learned by practice to be part of the normal life of the group and realizing that their living with HIV/AIDS was not their obstacle.

Good Food, Good Health for children living with HIV/AIDS

Project for Health Awareness of Children was a time limit special project in 2014. It was due to the fact that there were frequent sickness of the children effected by for long therapy of antiretroviral medicine. It caused the imbalance of the body of which under normal standard with the high Cholesterol. Therefore the focus of this project was good food with nutrition value intake, i.e. increase of vegetable, fruits and decrease the junk food. The project had encouraged for good food activities by nutritionist. There were competition of simple good food, monthly menu for healthy food, campaigning for day of healthy food. All activities had been supported by Nutrition Department of Camillian including the supplementary of exercises for children, driving bicycle, aerobic dancing, etc.

The side benefit of this project was the innovation of healthy menu of which the children can eat easily various vegetables with different cooking. Chefs of the Center also acknowledges the important of good food with good nutrition value for supporting the health of the children.

Capacity building on Life skills for Teenagers living with and affected by HIV/AIDS

When the children grew up to teenagers, their interest of opposite sex would increase and more self expression without any control. It resulted to their dislike of community daily life and wish to have more freedom on individual life. CSC Rayong recognized this issue, therefore in preparing them by developing the Project of Independent Living Center. The project was to support the teenagers to be self responsible for their own health regularly by taking the antiretroviral medicine on time to control HIV and going to see the doctor as scheduled. In addition, they should learn to be responsible for their future daily life.

The Capacity Building Camp on life skills was used to give the opportunity for them to work together with others and living in community. The first activity for training the teenagers was to travel by themselves to Uncle Kom's garden (camp) at Klung district of Chanthaburi province. Teenagers were divided by groups with 7 starting points. There were: (1) Paknam Rayong (2) Sattahip Km. 10; (3) Samnakton sub-district, Banchang district; (4) Nikompattana district; (5) Baankhai district; (6) Pae Port; and (7) Klang district. Teenagers had to do the planning for traveling

together, allocating expenditure budget for the trip which would suffice for each person in the group. When they reached the Camp, they had to be there for 3 full days activities. At the end of the trip, the result was those teenagers knew themselves, friends better and was able to adapt to each others.

Camillian had also organized for teenagers at the Center to have some joint activities for “capacity building” during the period of school vacation. The Center had supported the teenagers to work with staff in different department of Camillian Social Center Rayong including other network outside, such as Wang Chan Hospital, Suan Son Paragon Resort, Garage in Rayong province. During this one month training period, teenagers had to stay privately in a rent apartment and be self responsible for everything. The important was to take antiretroviral medicine regularly. This period as if they would live in a normal society alone for one month. At the end of this training, the Center would arrange discussion session to share their experiences among themselves and with their caregivers. It was the time for them to learn how to adjust themselves to the society.

“Service Mind” Way to do good and sacrifice for others

In the past, the orphaned teenagers living with and affected by HIV/AIDS at Camillian Social Center Rayong had received good support and chance by many kind people in society. It was the way to learn that good atmosphere social should have the sharing and support for each other. The teenagers living with HIV had shared their gifts to the children at the community of Kaotabaek, Plutaluang sub-district, Sattahip district, Chonburi province on the occasion of “National Children Day” in year 2014. The activities on that day had established the good relation and fun for the children at that community including their good attitude toward people living with HIV.

Education in classroom and outside classroom

Learning with understanding

Project of Independent Living Center had supported the education for teenagers as appropriate according to their ability to absorb. In the normal standard school of government had several activities outside classroom. Those activities had helped them to learn with practice way of living in social to prepare for their living in normal society in future. Those activities were: Sexual knowledge Camp for teenagers, Training for being happiness for teenagers by Psycho-social Expert from Ramathibodi Hospital. Moreover they had also participated at the First National Conference on Sexual Well-being regarding the teenage pregnancy. There were also some joint activities with Local Communities to promote the “Zero Discrimination on people living with HIV.”

Scholarship for Education of children living with and affected by HIV/AIDS

Children in Thailand has the right to access to basic education up to secondary level. However, the supporting factor for other expenditures is also needed. Camillian Social Center Rayong had launched the Project on Scholarship for children and teenagers living with and affected by HIV/AIDS who are in need but they live with their own families in local community. Most of those families were poor, therefore, Camillian provided financial support for each person for the amount 500-1,000 Baht per month for their food allowances. The project had supported 123 persons monthly. This financial support would continue until their graduation. For the past 15 years, this project had supported 219 persons and 59 of them had graduated diploma level.

Good Quality of life for vulnerable people living with HIV and AIDS patients: “Zero AIDS - Related deaths” and “Zero Discrimination”

Good quality of lives for vulnerable people living with HIV and AIDS patients was they should be able to live in the normal society without any opportunistic infections and no discrimination by family and social. They should live with human integrity. Camillian Social Center Rayong had tried to promote to people living with HIV and AIDS patients and their family in accessing to proper health care under the coverage of National Health Insurance System. In parallel the Center had taken care for the mental and spiritual dimensions. When they had better physical condition, they would also had good mental. As a result, the dead rate would decrease and those people could be part of the social economic development of the society.

Palliative Care Unit : way to support patients both physical and mental rehabilitation

Palliative Care Unit (PCU) was part of Camillian’s projects. It was located at Huaypong sub-district, Muang district, Rayong province. PCU had supported AIDS patients both vulnerable Thai and Foreigner at the age range of 13-72 years for a total of 88 persons. There were 83 patients at the end of 2013, there were 54 new arrival in 2014 with 20 dead cases and 29 reintegrated to normal society. These patients were lack of residence and rejected by their families. Camillian had provided 4 basic human needs to them including assisting them to access to the health care system of National Health Insurance System. Physical rehabilitation was also provided to the patients with difficulty of physical movement and gave them chances to participate with the social activities, i.e. occupational training, training on HIV/AIDS knowledge and basic human right. Moreover, Camillian had encouraged them to express their own

belief according to their tradition. Camillian Religious had also provided pastoral care focusing on spiritual dimension.

As the result of Camillian care, the AIDS patients had better quality of life, the disability of movement had improved and better self-movement for some cases. The dead rate had decreased compared with the statistic in past years. In 2014, there were 29 cases had already been integrated to the normal society. They were able to have a normal family life. Some of them had come back to Camillian to devote their work to support other weaker.

Palliative Care Unit:

Palliative care at home by family and community

Palliative Care Unit of Camillian Social Center Rayong and Mabthaphut Hospital had jointly established the networking of AIDS patients in supporting the home care system. There were 300 people in the community had grouped to act as “friends help friends”. They gathered together 4 times per month to discuss on knowledge of HIV/AIDS, opportunistic infections, side effects of antiretroviral treatments, etc. The sharing of experiences with the guide of experts had led them to understand and self practiced at home. They had later better cooperated with the medical doctors to follow up their treatment regularly. In addition, it was the way to promote the palliative care at home. Staff of PCU had regular made home-visit to follow up cases in order to ensure their proper understand in interpreting from method to practice. They also discussed about any obstacles or problems solving for their treatment. Camillian had encouraged and provided moral support to the patients and caregivers in living together in their own society.

Quality of life for AIDS patients living with disability

The Discrimination was part of the reason for AIDS patients refused to go to hospital. Another reason was that they were afraid of meeting the known friends. As the result, the case of patients were getting worse while lacking of regular treatment. Severe of opportunistic infections caused the disabilities for them. At present, there were 16 cases living with HIV and disabilities. They were strong enough to be reintegrated into normal society but they were rejected by their families. They had no other residence. Therefore Camillian Social Center Rayong had established a rehabilitation center for those rejected patients so-called “The Garden of Eden” at Baankhai district, Rayong province. Patients in the Garden of Eden were encouraged to be self-help for their daily life. They would organize their own ARV medicines, exercise for rehabilitation on their disability part, working on agriculture as suggested by the King for self-sufficient economic, i.e. growing vegetable, small handicraft, raising crickets, etc.

For future plan of Camillian Social Center Rayong, there was a need to develop a plan to take care of patients living with disability and unable to reintegrate into normal society as well as the new patients. In 2015, the Center should modify the residence to be appropriate for disabled and increase the training for small occupation for strong patients with disability. In the mean time, Camillian should encourage the strong HIV patients to volunteer in caring friends living with disability. Camillian should also seek the enterprise who would accept the strong HIV patients living with disability to work in their place.

The Garden of Eden prepared for the integration to social: Grow lime outside season, raise chicken for eggs as the concept of mixed agricultures

Camillian Social Center Rayong was located at 165/1, Moo 3, Nongbua sub-district, Baankhai district, Rayong Province. This was to provide the opportunity for people under caring of the Center and became strong but not yet ready to reintegrate into the normal society. They had no income and no residence. The Garden of Eden was to support them to generate income through some agriculture or handicraft skills for their survival.

There were 30 strong patients living with HIV in the Garden of Eden had decided to grow “lime” in 2014 and they grew 110 lime-trees. It was the organic type which gave product all year round to generate monthly income. They learned from an expert of agriculture in that area which had established the good relation among them. They also raised chicken to produce eggs. It gave quick and good results. They had expanded their chicken farm. At present they can sell chicken eggs daily of 10 packs from 350 chickens. They also grew banana-trees, dragon-fruits, vegetable, etc. They raised cows, boars, ducks, cat-fishes, frogs, crickets, etc. The HIV patients had also the handicraft skills to work on key-chains, blooms, artificial flowers, etc.

The products and income from this Garden of Eden had helped the Center for their food. The monthly income from selling of products was also kept for the patients. There were 9 people living with HIV in this Garden of Eden left for their own home in 2014. It was reintegrated at their own time.

Zero new HIV Infections

According to the report of the Ministry of Public Health, there was a decrease of the new HIV cases compared to the past 10 years with the hope of 5-10 years ahead, Thailand would have no more new HIV case. The risk of HIV cases in Thailand 83% was the unsafe sexual relation.

In addition of caring AIDS patients and orphaned children living with HIV, Camillian Social Center Rayong had also worked on the prevention of new cases on HIV/AIDS infection by providing education on HIV/AIDS to society since 1998 onward. There were more than 56,538 people had participated in the prevention of HIV infections activities under "Project on Education on HIV/AIDS Prevention". Out of 56,538 participants, there were 361 persons function as peer group to stimulate people for the prevention. It took place in schools, communities, work-places, entertainment-places. There were 6,685 people joining the prevention scheme on HIV/AIDS activities.

Working with children at primary level: Peer group for understanding sex education as well as prevention of HIV/AIDS

Camillian Social Center Rayong had developed two small projects for support children at primary level to acquire knowledge and skill on the issues of sex education and prevention of HIV/AIDS in 2014. It was to prepare those children to grow up as proper teenagers. They should know of the changing of physical, emotional, and social aspect in the process of being teenagers. If they did not know the proper information, they may face problem and solved in the wrong way particularly as regards to sexual issue. At present, Thailand was facing problem of young teenagers had early sexual relation. They would face the unwanted pregnancy, abortion, which showed that children had unsafe sex and also risk to have HIV infectious.

Project to challenge of brave step out from AIDS with safety measure for students of 4 schools in the municipal area of Mabtaphut and Project on Training of HIV/AIDS knowledge and prevention skills for students of 4 schools in Tapong sub-district. Those projects had created chances for students to discuss, speak, think, understand, etc on the sexual issues. It would be saved for them to talk openly without any fear with the right information.

Open discussions on the occasion of “World AIDS Day”: Zero Discrimination, Zero New HIV Infections

The increase of epidemiology data of HIV infections to young teenagers had called the awareness to 3 educational institutions in Rayong, i.e. Mabthaphut Technical College, Rayong Polytechnic College, and Rayongwittayakom Nikom-Utsahakarm School. In order to respond to this problem, they had jointly developed “Project on Education on HIV/AIDS prevention”. The project was to launch a campaign to students of different levels to acquire the proper information on HIV/AIDS, proper safety measure for prevention including understanding and accepting people living with HIV/AIDS.

Camillian Social Center Rayong had supported 3 educational institutions in developing plan for on-going HIV/AIDS prevention and activities for campaigning the World AIDS Day at their institutions. There were 90 peer group of administration staffs and students of all 3 institutions had jointly with Camillian Social Center Rayong to organize the celebration on the World AIDS Day. There were also other network i.e. Mabthaphut Hospital, and Eastern Network of People living with HIV/AIDS joined with the group for the celebration. Mabthaphut Municipality had provided financial support for the activity. It was a great success for this celebration in raising awareness for communities as regards to HIV/AIDS problem and the proper information. There were 1,214 students & teachers participated the event to acquire the proper knowledge.

Zero new HIV infections and Zero AIDS-related deaths : Work-places

Project on Education on HIV/AIDS prevention by Camillian Social Center Rayong had recognized the important of huge number of people working in the Industrial Estates area at Rayong province. Camillian had initiated to contact 35 factories to launch the campaign of HIV/AIDS prevention for their workers since 1999. For the last 16 years, the joint activities for the campaign of HIV/AIDS prevention had given enough knowledge to all workers in these areas particularly the positive thinking about HIV/AIDS people. They can accept people living with HIV/AIDS without any discrimination.

The witness measure was many workers of those factories came to Camillian Social Center Rayong to visit and donate food, equipment, and financial to children living with HIV/AIDS. Other factories had contacted Camillian to ask for joint activities on HIV/AIDS prevention. The Indorama Industrial Co., Ltd had jointly organized training on “AIDS and Tuberculosis” for their new workers and training on “Parents communicate with children on sexual issues”. Tokai Eastern Rubber Co., Ltd. had organized with Camillian for the campaign of “Safe-sex on Songkran Festival” and “Safe-sex with Condoms on New Year”. SRF Co., Ltd. had also launched the campaign on the occasion of the World AIDS Day. Ray Cole Asphalt Co., Ltd. had organized together with Camillian for their staffs on the subject of Education on Prevention of HIV/AIDS.

Process of public sector against solving AIDS problems: Eastern Network of people living with HIV/AIDS

Eastern Network of people living with HIV/AIDS was an organization established by the public sector gathering people living with HIV/AIDS to solve AIDS problems occurred with them and their families in all dimensions (physical, mental and social). Camillian Social Center Rayong had empowered the network since 2000 up to present. At present, there are 18,862 members of this network. Each member had pushed or received the problem solving through the people living with HIV/AIDS clubs in hospitals in Eastern Region: there were 8 provinces, Rayong, Chonburi, Chanthaburi, Trad, Prachinburi, Srakaew, Chachoengsao and Samutprakarn. At present, there are 63 Clubs.

Through all network of people living with HIV/AIDS, all patients can access to medical treatment. They can live in their own families and community. Some of them became the peer group to share and assist others in their community about HIV/AIDS knowledge. This is a good sign for living together without any discrimination.

Network of people living with HIV/AIDS - Zero AIDS-related deaths, Zero Discrimination: VCCT Campaign in local community

Eastern network of people living with HIV/AIDS had a speed-up plan in the community for the concurrence with national strategic plan for AIDS. It started with the initiation of persuade people in Eastern network to discuss on the VCCT campaign and looking for fundraising to support the activity. There was also a joint project with the Thai Health Promotion Foundation by having the Eastern people as target group. There were 7 clubs participating this pilot campaign. The target group was narrowed down to 5 sub-districts in each district. Main activity of VCCT campaign was to understand the team working spirit for service, prepare the service and contact leaders of the community. There should be a group discussion for 10 persons each time to evaluate self risk for HIV infection, and reach the service unit. When the peer group understood on HIV/AIDS issues, there should have a joint activity to serve as mobile public relation on HIV/AIDS issues to the community.

As the result, there were 546 persons came to consult on the HIV blood test and there were 254 had their HIV blood test. In addition, the peer group of each community had been accepted by their community to work in providing knowledge of HIV/AIDS. This had given the confidence and proud to the peer group for their work. They felt the value to work with the community and eager to develop the pro-active work plan for their community. The process of these activities would result to

some social change toward AIDS including the Zero AIDS-related deaths and Zero Discrimination.

**“Holistic Service Center”:
People living with HIV turn their function from “receiver’ to
“co-provider”**

Network of people living with HIV/AIDS in Thailand had used the participatory form of services for people living with HIV/AIDS patients with the holistic approach for the last 10 years. People living with HIV/AIDS main function was to provide information, counseling in hospital and there was a co-evaluate with hospital staff about the health status of the patients for referring. They should also monitor the health aspect, i.e. opportunistic infections, antiretroviral treatment. As for social aspect they should visit people at home and monitor the health status regularly and reported to the members during their monthly meeting.

There were 23 holistic service centers located in 6 provinces of Eastern Region. These networks had served 4,104 cases of people living with HIV/AIDS with 3,940 adults and 164 children. The recipients came from Antiretroviral Treatment Clinics for adults and children, and Clinic for pregnancy women. Holistic Service Centers would monitor all patients regularly and recording all medical and other relevant data. It can be used for future planning to promote the development of health service policy for people living with HIV/AIDS. This approach would lead to the UNAIDS policy on “Getting to Zero” in near future.

Social of caring each other

Camillian Social Center Rayong had started to care for all vulnerable people living with and affected by HIV/AIDS and after that encouraging them to reintegrate into normal society. It gave the opportunity for affordable people in the society to help people facing with problems and difficulties. This was the bridge to link two groups between the donors and receivers. This relation was through the fundraising in various forms, i.e. “The Bridge of Hope Project”, “One Bed, One Life, and One Sponsor Project”, “Lunch Project”, “Birthday Project”, “Factory Sponsorship Project”, and “Donation Box Project”, etc. The 147 orphaned children living with and affected by HIV/AIDS in the Center had been benefited by these projects. At the end of 2014, there were 384 continuing sponsors in Thailand and there were 559 donors of the Bridge of Hope Project supported orphaned children.

Annual Charity Dinner - “Gratitude and continue”

Camillian Social Center Rayong had organized an annual charity dinner called “The Bridge of Hope” in January each year. It was to promote sharing happiness for New Year and to take this opportunity to meet with all supporters to express “Gratitude”. Their support had provided better quality of life for orphans and vulnerable people living with and affected by HIV/AIDS.

Birthday Project

Camillian Social Center Rayong had launched another good activity to provide opportunity for people to do some kind of merit on their birthday. Most of people in Rayong and nearby provinces came to the Center to provide and donate in various forms as charitable activities. In 2014, there were 277 persons came to celebrate their birthday in the Center. They provided items, food, equipment, financial, etc. to the people living with HIV/AIDS in the Center. This had shown their understanding on HIV/AIDS without any discrimination.

Donors of the “Bridge of Hope Project” benefit to orphaned children living with and affected by HIV/AIDS

Camillian Social Center Rayong would not be in the position to support continually for all children and teenagers living with HIV without the support of people outside. “The Bridge of Hope Project” is one of the important tasks for better quality of life for those orphans to be able to access to education, healthcare and the 4 elements of human basic needs.

The Bridge of Hope Project had been supported from intra and inter country through the charity network since 2006 up to present. For the past 8 years, there were 559 donors from France supporting 59 orphaned children and teenagers. The number of donors had been decreased from Europe during the period of difficulty of world economic from 2013-2014. Camillian Social Center Rayong had tried to seek the new donors from elsewhere. For those orphans had been written to their supporters regularly. Some of the donors had visited the orphans to share their activities together at least one day. They talked, ate and travelled together to understand the life of the orphan and the mission of the Center.

Honorable reward and proud of the mission

Camillian Social Center Rayong had received the reward of “Prachabodi” from Her Royal Highness Princess Saomsawali in recognizing the contribution of the organization to benefit the vulnerable people. This was the third year of the reward activity and Camillian Social Center Rayong was recommended by the Office of Promotion and Protection of Children, Youth, the Elderly and Vulnerable groups under the Ministry Social Development and Human Security of Thailand. This recognition to show that the Center had been supporting the vulnerable people in social for better quality of life continuing more than 3 years.

Camillian Social Center Rayong would share this Honorable reward with all supporters of the Center.
